### RECYCLE OFTEN, RECYCLE RIGHT

The Town of Lockport has done very well with recycling. Our community recycles almost 28% of the waste placed at our curbs each week. However, there is always room for improvement. Every day we encounter hundreds of recyclable items. By recycling properly, you help materials get to their next best use, which in turn saves tons upon tons of raw materials, time, energy and expense.

It's time to rethink recycling. Please refer to the list on this page to establish what exactly can be recycled. Remember, liquids and non-recyclable items can spoil an entire load of otherwise recyclable paper. The worst item people try to recycle is plastic bags. These plastic bags get caught in the conveyor belts and jam the entire process. Please put plastic bags in your garbage.

Did you know recycling just one aluminum can saves enough energy to: Run a TV for two hours, or power a 10-watt LED light bulb for 24 hours, or power your computer for three hours? When

you think of the difference just one person could make, imagine the positive impact our whole community can make by recycling often and recycling right.

Waste Management has agreed to pick-up all recycling inside your cart, as well as next to the cart. But, and this is really important, our responsibility as Town residents, is to properly break down cardboard boxes and crush all containers that can limit space in your recycle cart. An ideal situation would be that Waste Management's recycle operators do not have to get out of their trucks to handle items outside your cart. If needed, additional carts may be purchased at the Town Clerk's Office for \$45/\$50, depending on size. This charge does not result in any Town profit. For more information

  - By law, all cats, dogs and domesticated ferrets must have a current rabies vaccination from four months of age and on.
  - Cats and dogs receiving immunization WITHOUT PROOF of a previous rabies immunization will receive a certificate valid only for one year. Cats and dogs WITH PROOF of previous rabies immunizations will receive a certificate valid for three years.
  - Ferrets must receive vaccinations annually, regardless of previous immunization.
- All Animals** must be properly restrained. Cats & Ferrets must be in a box or carrier. Dogs must be leashed.
- The Department does not offer dog or cat vaccinations other than rabies. It is very important for the health and well being of your animal and the other animals attending our rabies clinics, that they have seen a veterinarian and are up to date on all of their immunizations, to include dog parvo virus.**
- Volunteers are needed. Please call 439-7511 if interested.
- It is requested that anyone bringing more than six animals to one clinic contact the Niagara County Department of Health at 439-7511 up to one week prior to the clinic so paperwork can be processed more efficiently.

## **INCOME LIMIT CHANGE FOR ENHANCED STAR**

If you are currently have the BASIC STAR EXEMPTION, and will be turning 65 by December 31, 2019, you could be eligible for ENHANCED STAR.

The income-limit for the 2019 school tax year is \$86,300, as verified by the 2017 Federal or State Income Tax Return. You must meet the income and residency requirements; and must apply by March 1, 2019.

If you are not on the IVP (Income Verification Program), Enhanced STAR renewal forms are mailed out after 1<sup>st</sup> week of September

## **STAR CHANGES**

New homeowners, or those who are new to STAR, must register with NYS; either by phone at 518-457-2036 or through their website at [www.tax.ny.gov/star](http://www.tax.ny.gov/star).

New applicants who register, will now receive a check from NYS, instead of receiving a credit on their school tax bill.

Those already active in the STAR/Enhanced STAR exemption are not affected by this change.

## **OTHER STAR CHANGES**

ALL Enhanced STAR Exemption recipients, MUST apply to the IVP (Income Verification Program). Even if you don't file tax returns.

New forms and instructions will be sent with the renewal forms.

ALSO, those on the Low Income Senior Exemption, must apply for the Enhanced STAR through IVP as well. All information will be included in your renewal packets in December.

## **SALES MARKET**

Residents, in the Town of Lockport, are very fortunate to continually have increasing property values/sales. For those not following our sales market, homes have been selling over assessed value, with many 20 to 60% over their assessment. Here's the BUT, we need to be prepared for increased assessments. Please keep in mind, assessments are estimated values, based on the sales market, AND have nothing to do with tax rates. Ask yourself, "If I were to sell my house today, what can I get for it?"

# Highway Department



**Refuse/Recycling Pick Up:** Please remember to have your garbage/recycling out by 6 am. Also, if your garbage/recycling haven't been picked up, remember there may be a few things that have happened. The truck could've broken down, a new driver may be doing the route and they do have to empty the truck. If you still haven't been picked up by 3 pm, please call the highway office at 439-9522. The highway clerk will call our representative from Waste Management to find out what is happening. You are allowed one large item per week. If Waste Management doesn't pick it up with the garbage, leave it out and they will come back in a day or two and get it. You don't have to call to have a large item picked up.

If you would like another recycling tote, you may purchase one at the town clerk's office. 65 gal totes are \$45.00 and 96 gal totes are \$50.00. They will let the highway clerk know about the purchase and she will have it delivered.

**Brush Pick Up:** Brush pick up will continue until the third Monday in November. Please have it out by Sunday night or no later than 7 am on Monday morning.

**Winter Snow Removal Reminders:**

\*\*No parking on town roads from Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> – April 1<sup>st</sup> from 1 am – 7 am \*\*State Law: no one is permitted to push snow across the road or deposit snow in the roadway with either plows, snow blowers or shovels. Residents who hire outside contractors for this service are asked to remind them of this law. Tickets may be issued for offenders.

\*\*Please do not tailgate trucks as they sometimes have to back up at some intersections.

\*\*Mailboxes are never damaged intentionally. Please call the highway office for repairs or replacement, 439-9522. NOTE: only standard mailboxes and steel posts are used for replacement. If you have an expensive and/or decorative mailbox, you may want to consider replacing it for the winter.

# Building Inspector

**2015 International Fire Code; 505.1 Address Identification:** New and existing buildings shall be provided with approved address identification. The address identification shall be legible and placed in a position that is visible from the street or road fronting the property... Each character shall not be less than 4 inches high...

**2015 International Fire Code; 505.5.4 Obstruction:** Unobstructed access to fire hydrants shall be maintained at all times. The fire department shall not be deterred or hindered from gaining immediate access to fire protection equipment or fire hydrants. 505.5.5: a 3 – foot clear space shall be maintained around the circumference of fire hydrants, except as otherwise required or approved.

I am updating an older article, and putting it out there for those that may be new or missed it the first time because "THE OWL IS BACK TO WELCOME YOU TO THE RAPIDS"!!

### **"The Rapids", Uncle Joe Edwards, The "Owl"**

Here is (part) of the History of the Hamlet – "The Rapids", located in the North East section of the Town bordered by the Tonawanda Creek. The area was a desirable fishing area for Native Americans in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, and was called "The Old Fishing Ground". When Joseph Ellicott surveyed the area, he designated a piece of land on the North side of the Creek that was to be reserved for a Native American fishing area, never to be sold.



Land in the Rapids area was "Booked" as early as 1802, but the first settler did not build until 1823, and then sold to Robert Kinne in 1835. Amos and S.B. Kinne bought land from the heirs of Joseph Ellicott in 1839. They platted a portion into Lots, and marketed them. Little happened until 1849, when Orange Mansfield built a Steam Saw Mill near the Creek. Over the next few years there would be a Church, Blacksmith Shops, 2 Stores, a Cider Mill, and about 80 residents.

The "Most Important, and Colorful" resident of The Rapids would have to be Joseph Edwards, known as Uncle Joe, and the Sage of The Rapids. He also claimed to be an elected Judge in the Town for 24 years, but I have been unable to verify that to be factual.

Joseph Edwards was born in Coburgh, Ont., on May 9, 1840. His family moved to Buffalo, N.Y. for a year in 1849, and then moved to the Tonawanda Creek area – we know that he and his father worked in Clarence part of the time, and that Joe taught School in Clarence and The Rapids for 20 years. He also taught the Violin and played at Barn Dances.

Around 1881 he purchased the "Rue and Wykoff" store (which is still a residence), on the Creek bank at the West end of Plank Road, and was appointed Postmaster. The Store was known as "The Wigwam", and was a favorite gathering place. Across the road was an old tree that

housed a family of Owls. It was said that Uncle Joe and the Owl were silent admirers, and thus Joe adopted the pseudonym "The Rapids Owl" for his writings in the Lockport U S & J in the early 1900's. His articles, called "A Hoot From The Owl" were written with the wit and wisdom of an owl, about the happenings in the Rapids area. He wrote stories about the information shared at the Barn Dances, the effects of weather, and the accomplishments of local children.

Uncle Joe Edwards lived in the Rapids/Clarence area for about 69 years, He died Nov. 5, 1936 at the age of 96. Uncle Joe and his brother William, are buried with their wives at Riverdale Cemetery in Lewiston, N.Y.

Now for the rest of the story – About the Rapids Owl – after Uncle Joe died, the "Owl Club", the social arm of the Rapids Volunteer Fire Company, wanted to honor the memory of Joe Edwards with the Insignia of their Club.

They built an Owl, 8 feet tall and 5 feet wide from ear to ear, with a wooden frame and metal skin, and Blinking Eyes. The Owl was mounted on a 4 foot high concrete base, at the intersection just west of the "old" Fire Hall. The Owl was dedicated on Saturday, May 22, 1937. A large crowd, with many dignitaries was present to honor Joe. A rain storm during the Ceremony caused the event to be cancelled and held the following Saturday. The Owl honored Uncle Joe until the early 1990's, when it disappeared.

I had been trying to locate "The Owl" for several years, and about 7 or 8 years ago, a friend told me where it was. The person gave it to me as long as I promised that it would be refurbished and returned to Fire Company property.

This was supposed to happen in the Fall or Summer of 2015, but did not, and FINALLY, about 7 years after I acquired it --- the foundation was poured this August. Dave Miller, Town Highway Superintendent installed the "Rapids Owl" on Rapids Fire Co. ground, west of the Fire Hall, on Sat. 8/25/2018.

2015 was the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Birth of Joe Edwards, and "Rapids Community Day" celebrated it, and continues this year. Plans are under way for a Celebration when "The Owl" will again welcome people to "The Rapids".
