FROM THE SUPERVISOR'S DESK

Holding The Line

No one would disagree that taxes in New York State are too high, they are. Among those we are all faced with are NYS Income Tax, County Taxes, School Taxes, Sales Tax, and Town Fees. And if that's not enough, now we're fighting inflation!

The Lockport Town Board is aware of this burden and is continuously working to keep our portion as low as possible. In 2021, I asked our department heads to cut 5% out of their budget requests. They cut that amount, and in some cases, more. This fall, we will start converting our 550 street lights to LEDs. This project will be paid for out of our General Fund, thus not adding a penny to our Town debt. This project alone will save us approximately \$90,000 a year. Also, we are fortunate to have 5 volunteer

fire companies. While there still is an expense, it is only a fraction compared to a full-time force. We have New York State Troopers and Niagara County Sheriffs serving our very important law enforcement needs.

Lastly, we have a team of extremely dedicated Town Employees working to provide the basic services of highway, water, sewer, clean parks, and administrative support to our Town residents. We can't stop all increases in operational expenses, but we can work to contain some of these costs through constantly looking for cost cutting efficiencies without compromising quality. That's our promise to you.

EVENT UPDATES!

We are proud to announce that the Town of Lockport will be hosting a Tire Drop Off and Paper Shredding event on September 25th from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. This event will be held at Town Hall, 6560 Dysinger Rd. Our annual Paper Shredding event is always well attended. Please bring your confidential paper item (great way to get rid of those old tax returns). Please remove the binder clips and any metal items such as hanging file folders as they jam the shredding equipment. We limit the quantity to eight (8) containers (bags, totes, etc.) per residence. If you wish, you can wait and watch as your paper materials are placed in the shredder. This event is for Town of Lockport residents only.

Also, on the same day we are holding our first Tire Drop Off. Our residents have continually asked if we would try to arrange this event and we are excited to finally be able to provide this service. Tires must be 24" or smaller. We will not accept tires on rims, and there will be an eight (8) tire limit per residence. This is a one time only event and is available only to Town of Lockport residents.

Please note: There will not be a household hazardous waste drop off this year.

NOTE FROM: The Dog Control Officer

NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets requires that all dogs four (4) months and older with a current rabies vaccination be licensed.

FEE SCHEDULE:

(Must be renewed annually at the Town Clerk's office)

- Spayed/neutered dog - **\$8.00**
- Non-spayed/non-neutered dog - **\$18.00**

The Dog Control Officer's duties include: enforcement of dog licensing and ordinances and dog bite investigations.

Dogs must be effectively restricted or controlled by a person or a leash not exceeding 15 feet in length. Since it is the law, KEEP ID TAGS ON YOUR DOGS AT ALL TIMES. If your dog goes missing, contact us immediately. If the animal has identification tags on and was licensed in the Town of Lockport, we can expedite the process of returning the animal to the owner. Please note, we cannot release them if they are not licensed. In the case of no identification, the dog will be taken to the Niagara County SPCA where you will be required to provide proof of licensing and rabies vaccination along with paying a \$25 redemption fee at the office before attempting to pick up your dog.

on the Monday preceding each event

- By law, all cats, dogs and domesticated ferrets must have a current rabies vaccination from four months of age and on.
- Cats and dogs receiving immunization WITHOUT PROOF of a previous rabies immunization will receive a certificate valid only for one year. Cats and dogs WITH PROOF of previous rabies immunizations will receive a certificate valid for three years.
- Ferrets must receive vaccinations annually, regardless of previous immunization.
- All Animals must be properly restrained. Cats & Ferrets must be in a box or carrier. Dogs must be leashed.
- The Department does not offer dog or cat vaccinations other than rabies. It is very important for the health and well being of your animal and the other animals attending our rabies clinics, that they have seen a veterinarian and are up to date on all of their immunizations, to include dog parvo virus.
- Niagara County hereby disclaims any and all liability, damages and/or claims for any adverse reaction(s) experienced by any animal, including, but not limited to, allergic reactions to vaccines, allegedly caused by receiving vaccinations at any participating Niagara County Clinic. Pet owners assume the risk of any alleged adverse reactions from a vaccination experienced by any animal which receives a vaccine from a Niagara County Clinic. Pet owners are encouraged to consult with a private veterinarian should they have any questions or concerns as to how their specific pet(s) may react to any specific vaccine.

Shaeffer Cemetery was recently honored with a historic marker funded by the William G. Pomeroy Foundation. The cemetery is located on the north side of Dysinger Road just west of Crosby Road. There are a few Civil War veterans interred here.



• Newfane native John Gassaway (1843-1869) served as a saddler in the 7th New York Cavalry Regiment during the Civil War from August 26, 1861 through March 31, 1862. Afterward, he married and settled in Lockport, but sadly, a few years later he died of typhoid fever. Two of his infant daughters are buried next to him.

• Private Jeremiah Russell (1843-1883) served in Company F of the 4th Michigan Volunteer Infantry. He was wounded at the Battle of Malvern Hill by being “shot through the neck and left shoulder producing partial paralysis of left arm.” He mustered out December 12, 1862 due to his disability. He worked as a house painter for a number of years before becoming a butcher. He succumbed to tuberculosis.

• On July 28, 1863, Private William W. Wertman Sr. (1841-1904) enlisted into Company E of the 122nd Infantry, known as the Onondagas. He was wounded at the battle of Cold Harbor on June 1, 1864 and mustered out due to his wounds on December 23, 1864.

• Asa J. Worden (about 1838-1870) was a musician in Company F of the New York 151st Infantry Regiment. While it may sound like an unlikely pairing, music and war have a long history. Music was a recreational diversion between battles and used as a form of communication at camp, as well as during battle. A Union

army regulation required every infantry, artillery, or cavalry company to have at least two musicians. Worden was discharged at the rank of Private in 1865.

• Private Jacob Vogle or Vogel (1840-1874) served in the 11th Regiment, Pennsylvania Infantry from 1862 through 1865.

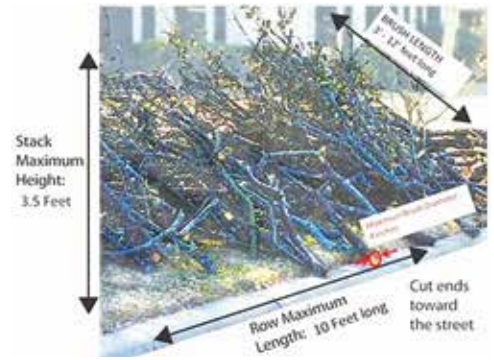
Brush Pick Up: We pick up brush on the third Monday of the month from March until November. **The following rules will be enforced for the town wide brush pick-up:**

- Tree removal companies are to remove all of their own debris.

- A maximum amount of one tandem truckload will be picked up at a time at any one residence.
- No brush will be picked up that is stacked around hydrants, guardrails, vent pipes, signs, or any obstacle. We will not be responsible for anything under the pile of brush that we cannot see. Large piles are picked up with large machinery.

Garbage/Recycling: Please have your garbage and recycling out by 6 am. If your garbage/recycling isn't picked up please remember there could be a reason why from a truck being emptied to a new driver, etc. Please be patient. If it still isn't picked up by 3 pm, please call the highway office, 439-9522. Please remember you are allowed one large item per week with your garbage. You may put **air conditioners** and **dehumidifiers** out with your garbage but the freon must be removed. **Compact discs, fiber glass and fluorescent lights** are to be thrown away. **Fire extinguishers**, please call your local fire department or Hazman, 998-8073. **Batteries** may be taken to a battery recovery facility/auto parts store.

Road Work: As the weather is getting warmer, please be cautious when our employees are working on the roads. They work hard to keep our roads looking good and safe. Obey the flagmen and signs to ensure safety. Thank you and we appreciate your cooperation.

Sec. 305 Barrier Requirements, 305.2: Outdoor pools and spas and indoor swimming pools shall be surrounded by a barrier that complies with section 305.2.1 through 305.7. 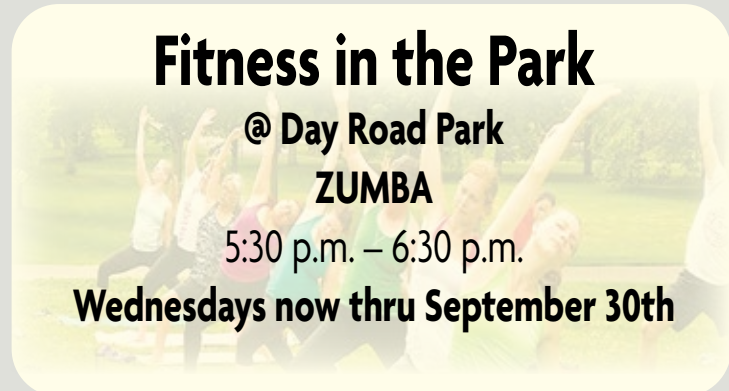

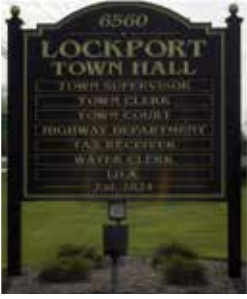
